chimney in the State and Government House, & account allowed.

Returns having been received from the several Electoral
Districts, of the Election held on Monday the 10th Instant, for the
choice of Electors on the part of this State, for choosing a President
and Vice President of the United States, the Board proceeded to examine
and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every person voted
for, as an Elector, & ascertained, when it appeared, that Henry Browner
