Upon receipt of the information and evidence therein mentioned,
the following Proclamation was issued by His Excellency the Governor, with
the advice of the Council, viz.

By His Excellency Daniel Martin

Governor of Maryland

Whereas authentic information hath been received by the Executive
of this State that a certain David McLaughlin was lately shot and killed
by a certain John Taylor Kidd, in Cecil County, and that the said Kidd
hath fled from Justice. And whereas it is of the first importance to
Society that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to Justice.
Now therefore I Daniel Martin Governor of the State of Maryland
have thought it proper to issue this my Proclamation, and do, by
and with the advice and consent of the Council offer a reward of
100 dollars to any person or persons who shall apprehend the
said John Taylor Kidd, and lodge him in any Jail or that he may
be brought to Justice for the said offence.
