Ordered that the Inspectors of Stables at the State Warehouse
in Baltimore immediately remove the Stables, now in Calhoun's
Warehouse to the new State Warehouse building by Landon & Tawman,
and that notice be given to James A. Buchanan that Calhoun's Warehouse
will be given up on the first day of April next.

By the petition of James Barrows, accompanied by a transcript from
the County of Harry County Court, it appears, that he entered into a recognizance
in the sum of twenty dollars with the Sheriff & William & Elias Wingate
his security, in the sum of ten dollars each, for his personal appearance before
the said County Court, and for his good behavior towards John Jameson,
It also that the said recognizance was forfeited, at August Term 1827
of the said Court. The Petitioner states, that some time in the summer
of 1827, a difference happened between him and a certain John Jameson,
upon which occasion, he the said petitioner, being much exasperated expressed
himself in such a manner as to alarm the said Jameson, who had
him recognized as aforesaid. He further states that he had no intention
to assault the said Jameson, nor did he commit a breach of the peace in
any other manner, that he would have appeared to save his recognizance,
but was unable to attend in consequence of a dangerous illness, as will
appear by an affidavit accompanying his petition, that there was no
prosecution instituted against him for committing a breach of the peace, or
for assaulting the said Jameson. He, therefore prays a remission of
the said fine. And the said Court having recommended a compliance
with the prayer of the petitioner we do hereby remit the said forfeiture.
