

the said Court, at March Term 1832 the sum of fifty dollars for doing the same
Licence. The petitioner states that he is an orphaned son, and by trade, is
that he removed to Washington County from the State of Pennsylvania, and opened a
shoe store, in connection with his shoe factory, in the Town of Williamsport about the
month of May 1831, and sold shoes and boots bought by him for the purpose, so
that before he proceeded to sell, he made enquiry of a constable, whom he considered
the proper officer to apply to in such case, to know whether or not he was required
by the Laws of the State to obtain a Licence to enable him to prosecute the business
he contemplated, and that the constable informed him, that for his, the constable's
opinion, he was not so required. He states that he made the said enquiry of the
Constable in consequence of having heard while in Pennsylvania many and reporting
in relation of a Licence Law in Maryland and because he considered the
constable the proper officer to give him the information he sought, for in
consequence of its being in Pennsylvania the duty of the Constable to make
return of Licence trade, that after being informed, as he is presently, was
that the Laws of this State required a Licence to authorize him to prosecute
his business, he stated to the Clerk of Washington County. He also
represents that his circumstances are very moderate and that he could not
pay said fine without much inconvenience, that he has a large family
dependent upon his exertions and that his stock in Trade is, and has been,
been small. He therefore prays for remission of the said fine. And
two of the Judges of the said Court, and the prosecuting Attorney having
recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner. And
do hereby remit so much of the said fine as is payable to the State.

Dean resigned, and Commission issued to them accordingly.
