The following commission and instruction was issued
to the aforesaid agent, viz.

The State of Maryland, To Henry Thompson, Gentleman
greeting. Do it known, that reposing great trust and confidence in
your prudence and honesty, George Howard Governor of the State
of Maryland have appointed you my agent to receive from His Excellency
the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania a certain Charles W.
Francis, late of the City of Baltimore a fugitive from the Justice
of this State; and I do hereby, authorize and direct you upon receiving
the said fugitive, to bring him into this State, and convey and deliver
him to the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore County, to answer for
having on the 17th Instant, feloniously misbezelled and stolen Bank
notes, and checks on Banks in the said City of Baltimore, or the funds
arisen for such checks, amounting to the sum of five hundred and fifty
four dollars seventy cents, with which the said Charles W. Francis
(being a Clerk for the said Henry M. Williams) had been entrusted
by the said Williams, for deposit in the old Maryland Savings Institution.
