

of the said fine. And the said Court and many respectable citizens of the  
said County having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioners,  
we do hereby remit the said fine, so far as the same is payable to the State.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by  
and with the advice and consent of the Council, Benjamin S. Forrest Esquire  
of Montgomery County was appointed agent to settle and adjust the claims of the  
State upon the general Government and more particularly for Interest on her  
expenditures with the last War on account of the United States, and Commissions  
issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Assistant General apply to the proper  
Officers of the United States Government, for two hundred fifty Rifles, sixty muskets, one  
hundred and fifty Rifle accoutrements, including flasks, and also sixty Cavalry  
swords, sixty Pistols and sixty Horses, with all accoutrements.

Ordered that the Treasurer at Annapolis deliver to the  
Assistant General one of the following Pistols.

Upon consideration of the representation and proofs submitted  
by Samuel Stamp, Inspector General of Flour in the City of Baltimore,  
in relation to the conduct of Isaac S. Finchcomb and of the Assistant  
Inspector, and to his suspension from said Office by the said Samuel  
Stamp, and upon considering also the answer of the said Finchcomb, and  
other representations and documents submitted by him in his defence, the  
following Preamble and Resolutions were adopted Viz.

The Governor and Council, having carefully examined  
the charges made by Samuel Stamp, Inspector General of Flour for the  
City of Baltimore against Isaac S. Finchcomb and of the Assistant Inspector  
of Flour for the said City, and of opinion, that the conduct of the said Stamp  
was fully correct in suspending the said Assistant Inspector, and in detaching  
him to great credit for his prompt and diligent attention to the duties of his  
Office, but in consideration of the nature with which the said Assistant Inspector  
acted, and the great accumulation of Flour to be inspected, and furthermore  
considering that the said Stamp, by still the power to suspend, in case  
he should hereafter find it necessary, &c.

Resolved, that Isaac S. Finchcomb be and he is hereby  
reinstated as Assistant Inspector of Flour for the City of Baltimore.

Resolved, that the above Preamble and Resolutions be published  
and printed in the Baltimore Patriot and Commercial Chronicle.
