Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Wm. A. Watkins and Joseph H. Nicholson or order three hundred dollars for preparing an Index to the Laws and Resolutions of the two last Sessions of the General Assembly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Joseph Sands or order twelve dollars fifty seven cents for freight on Boxes of Arms and Books, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jeremiah Hughes or order three hundred and eight dollars fifty cents, viz for 10,000 Marriage Licenses for the Treasurer \$250, for publishing Laws relative to the colored population, and Licenses by order of the Clerk of the Council under a Resolution of the General Assembly and for papers containing the same for other printers \$34.25, for publishing several proclamations and advertisements by order of the Executive \$18, for printing certificates for Laws \$2 and for a copy of the Constitution and 5 sand boxes for the Executive \$1.25. An amount proved and passed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Daniel Hart or order five dollars fifty cents, viz for hiring and binding two copies of the Plat of Public Lands Westward of Fort Cumberland \$5, and for two stumblers for the Court of Appeals fifty cents, & amount proved and passed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Elizabeth Simmons or order six dollars seventy five cents for one quarters salary for cleaning the public Temple, due the first instant.
