

October 15th 1832

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a writ of Habeas Corpus to James Callahan on account of a warrant issued on Joseph Mayo, with which he stood charged in Anne Arundel County. (See Prison Record)

October 16th 1832

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a writ of Habeas Corpus to Samuel Keating on account of a charge of receiving stolen goods with which he stood charged in Baltimore City Court

October 20th 1832

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John Bacon Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf & Dumb or his order thirteen hundred and sixty five dollars seventy cents for the tuition and support of indigent pupils from this State for six months ending the first Instant pro account.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Mrs. Anne Gedache or order forty dollars for one quarter pension due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Newman or order seventy five dollars for one quarter salary as Armorer at Easton due the first Instant.

October 23rd 1832

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William McKier or order ninety eight dollars eighty cents on account of printing, index to the Laws prepared by Gideon Pearce, John V. Watkins and Joseph & Nicholas requiring under contract with the Executive by a Resolution of the General Assembly.

Monday October 29th 1832

The Council met agreeably to Special call.

By the petition of Frances Weedon, Widow of James Weedon, and a transcript from the Records of Anne Arundel County Court, it appears that the said James Weedon was fined by the said Court at April Term 1831, the sum of thirty dollars on account of disorderly conduct. The Petitioner states that shortly after the date of the said fine her said husband departed this life.
