

Returns having been received from the several Electoral Districts of this State, of the Election held on Monday the 12th Instant, for Electors to choose a President and Vice President of the United States, the board proceeded to enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every person voted for as an Elector as aforesaid, whereupon it appeared that Joseph Kent, William B. Tyler, William Rice and Gerard V. Cousin Esquires, in and for the first district; Upton S. Heath and William Trickett Esquires, in and for the second district; John Spear Smith Esquire, in and for the third district; and John V. Steele, Robert H. Goldborough and Albert Constable Esquires, in and for the fourth district were duly elected Electors on the part of this State, for choosing a President and Vice President of the United States. Whereupon the following Proclamation was issued as directed by Law. Viz.

Whereas, by an act of the General Assembly of this State, passed at a November Session eighteen hundred and five, entitled "An act to reduce into one the several acts of Parliament respecting elections and to regulate said elections," it is directed that the Governor and Council, on receiving the returns of elections for Electors to choose a President and Vice President of the United States, shall enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every person voted for as an Elector, and shall thereupon declare by Proclamation signed by the Governor the name of the person or persons duly elected in each respective district. And an Election having been held, on Monday the twelfth Instant, agreeably to Law, in the several Electoral Districts of this State, for Electors to choose a President and Vice President of the United States as aforesaid, and full returns of the said elections having been received, and the number of votes given for each and every person voted for as an Elector as aforesaid, having been enumerated and ascertained, by the Governor and Council, we do, by this our Proclamation declare that, by the said returns, it appears that Joseph Kent, William B. Tyler, William Rice and Gerard V. Cousin Esquires in and for the first district; Upton S. Heath and William Trickett Esquires in and for the second district; John Spear Smith Esquire, in and for the third district; and John V. Steele, Robert H. Goldborough and Albert Constable Esquires, in and for the fourth district, were duly elected Electors on the part of this State for choosing a President and Vice President of the United States.
