In the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council James Harwood James Ferguson and William Brown were appointed Commissioners to fix a scale of tolls payable to the Baltimore and Chesapeake Steam Towing Company from any owner or master or agent or consignee of any vessel for entering into and using any tracks which may be opened by the said company, and which shall use the said tracks without being towed by any of the vessels of said company. Vice Henry Thompson, William Patterson, and Robert D. Burns who declined serving, and commissions issued to them, accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Worthington or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary as a member of the Council, due the 1st Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Turner or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary as a member of the Council, due the 1st Instant.
