Monday January 7th 1833.

January 9th 1833

Thursday January 17th 1833.

James Thomas Esquire Governor Elect, this day attended
in the General Assembly and in the request of both branches of
the General Assembly, commended by a Proclamation, the
services of the Council of the Governor and of the Council of
Frederick County, and in the presence of the Council of the Governor,
in stating the duty prescribed by the Constitution and of the
State and by repeating and subscribing a declaration of his
belief in the Christian Religion.
