

The State of Maryland, To Henry Thompson Esquire, Mayor of the City of Baltimore.  
 Greeting: Be it known, that, reposing great trust and confidence in your  
 wisdom and honesty, James Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland, having appointed  
 you agent to receive from His Excellency the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania,  
 Bentzelle, a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and I do hereby authorize  
 and direct you, upon receiving the said fugitive, to bring him into this State, and  
 deliver him to the Sheriff of the County of Frederick to answer for having  
 previously passed a certain false, forged and counterfeited note purporting to be a  
 genuine note of the President and Directors of the Commercial and Finance Bank  
 of Baltimore, knowing the said note to be false, forged and counterfeited.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of  
 Maryland, this second day of February in the year of our Lord,  
 one thousand eight hundred and thirty three, and of the  
 Independence of the United States the fifty seventh.

Thursday, March 5th 1833
