

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James Hill, or order fifteen dollars for one quarter Rent of Magazine due the 3^d Instant.

Resolved by the Governor & Council, that the further services of the agents appointed to supervise the printing of the Report on the digest of the Constitution and Statutes of this State, under the Resolution of the General Assembly passed at December Session 1831, be dispensed with, until John Buchanan and Revere J. Johnson Esquires, who were appointed by the Executive to prepare and report said digest, shall signify this Department, in Writing, that said work is ready for the press.

Resolved that Jeremiah Hughes be forthwith informed by the Clerk of the Council, that the further printing of the Report on the digest of the Constitution and Statutes of this State under the Resolution passed at December Session 1831, be discontinued until further instructed by this Department.

Resolved, that so soon as this Department is informed by John Buchanan and Revere J. Johnson Esquires, that the above report is ready for the press, the Clerk of the Council inform Jeremiah Hughes, that he may proceed with the printing of the said Report.

Resolved that this board will allow no compensation to Lotteon Packley and James Raymond Esquires, nor to Jeremiah Hughes, for supervising and printing the Constitution and Statutes upon which they have been engaged, until evidence is furnished to this Department from John Buchanan and Revere J. Johnson Esquires, that the said work has been prepared by them in pursuance of the Resolution of the Legislature no 95, passed at December Session 1831.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to John Slaughtery, on account of "resisting a Constable whilst in the discharge of his official duty", and also on account of an assault & battery, of which he was convicted in Washington County Court, at the November Term 1832, and for which he was sentenced to six months imprisonment in the Jail of the County, and to enter into a recognizance with good and sufficient security, jointly and severally, in the sum of one hundred dollars, to keep the peace for one year." Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Washington G. Puck or order twenty five dollars fifty cents for firing three Salutes in memory of the birth day of General Washington, & account passed.
