Thanksgiving Nov. 1832 \$2.50; advertisement for Printing in 1832 \$2 &
in 1833, \$1 - for furnishing Stationary in 1834 \$3; to fit up the State Library
\$3.25; and for Proclamation in Nov 1836 to preserve Order \$19.25
Amount allowed.
