

Notions of the Election held on the 13th Instant, for Sheriff of  
Garrett County having been received, and it appearing that Nicholas  
Kelly and Isaac Cern had received the greatest number of legal  
votes for said office and were, consequently, declared and  
returned duly elected, and the said Nicholas Kelly, having received a greater  
number of votes than the said Isaac Cern, His Excellency the  
Governor, commissioned the said Nicholas Kelly as Sheriff of the  
said County.

By the petition of Charles Howell, and transcripts from the  
Records of Allegany County Court, it appears that he was fined by the said  
Court in two or three cases six dollars in each case, for selling liquor  
within License.

The Petitioner states that previous to the commission of the said  
offences, he applied to the Clerk of Allegany County Court for a License  
to retail liquor and tendered him the money for such License, but was  
refused a License by the said Clerk from a misapprehension of his duty.  
The Petitioner further states that he is poor, and that at the same term the  
said fines were imposed he obtained his final discharge under the insolvent  
Laws, and that he has a family entirely dependant upon him for support.  
He therefore prays to be released from the said fines. And the Clerk  
of said Court having intimated that the said Charles Howell did  
apply to him for a License to retail liquor, and he refused to grant, bearing  
from the instructions of the Court and Jury that he was not authorized  
to grant the said License. And the Chief Judge of the said Court,  
having recommended a remission of the whole or part of said fines,  
we do hereby remit the same.

By the petition of John Warrick and a transcript from  
the Records of Allegany County Court, it appears that the said John  
Warrick, William Shaw and George Spear entered into a Recognizance  
to the said Court with James Warrick as Security for the  
appearance of the said James Warrick before Allegany County  
Court at October term 1812 to answer a charge of forging, and that  
the said Recognizance has been forfeited.

The Petitioner states that since they entered into the said  
Recognizance the said James Warrick has gone to the West.  
And many respectable citizens of the said County having recommended  
a remission of the said forfeiture and the Chief Judge of the said Court  
having also recommended the remission of at least a part of the same.
