By the petition of Currier H. Prigg and a transcript from the Records of Harford County Court, it appears that on the 21st day of August 1834, he entered into a Recognizance with George Hamby in the sum of one hundred dollars for the appearance of the said George Hamby before Harford County Court to answer a charge of bastardy, and that the said Recognizance has been forfeited.

The petitioner states that in compliance with the requisition of the Law, he brought the said Hamby into Court, and so informed the deputy of the Attorney General, and desired the said deputy to release him from his said Recognizance, that he was impressed with the belief that the production and surrender as aforesaid operated as a release from said Recognizance, that the said Hamby has departed the State to parts unknown to the petitioner. He therefore prays to be discharged from said forfeiture. And many respectable citizens of the said County having recommended a remission of the said forfeiture, and the Chief Judge of the said Court having stated that "the enforcing of this recognizance against Mr. Prigg would greatly harass and distress him, without I apprehend being of service to anyone - Mr. Prigg has not the slightest chance of ever getting him, to get to bring him before the Court, as I am informed and believe, he has gone to the Western Country." - We do hereby remit the said forfeiture
