Hawkins. Now therefore, I Thomas W. Nagoy Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State, to let the said James R. Hawkins, agent as aforesaid, pass with the said fugitive unmolested to the said State of Virginia: let the said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner, and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner.
