To Calia Anderson, free Negro, on account of Stealing a pair of Prunelle shoes, of which she was convicted in Somerset County Court at November Term 1836, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

To Michael Sheels, on account of Stealing a Silver Watch, of which he was convicted in Cecil County Court, at October Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for four years.

To Sarah Johnson, on account of Felony, of which she was convicted in Montgomery County Court, at March Term 1836, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for three years.
