

Tuesday April 25<sup>th</sup> 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Elice or order twelve dollars due for one set of Encyclopaedia of Geography purchased by authority of the Joint Committee on the State Library & Certificate of the Librarian.

Saturday April 29<sup>th</sup> 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jonas Green or order one hundred dollars for one complete set of the Edinburgh Encyclopaedia purchased by authority of the Joint Committee on the State Library, & Certificate of the Librarian.

Tuesday May 2<sup>nd</sup> 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Elizabeth Simmons or order thirteen dollars fifty cents for six months pay for cleaning the public Temple, due the first instant.

Tuesday May 9<sup>th</sup> 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order thirty dollars fifty cents for expenses of said compensation for bringing John Gray, a fugitive from Justice from Washington City, & amount allowed.

Friday May 12<sup>th</sup> 1837.

His Excellency the Governor granted the following Pardons

To John Bull, on account of assaulting and beating Conrad Turnbaugh, of which he was convicted in Baltimore County Court, at April Term 1837, and for which he was sentenced to six months imprisonment, and to pay a fine of one dollar.

To Bargillai Moore, on account of Stealing a Hog, of which he was convicted in Dorchester County Court at April Term 1837, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

To Daniel McBride, on account of Perjury, of which he was found guilty in Allegany County Court, at October Term 1836, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years.
