

Tuesday May 16th 1837

His Excellency the Governor has granted a Pardon to John Murray on account of a charge of Felony, pending against him in Baltimore City Court (to which he had pleaded Guilty) changing the condition annexed to a former Pardon for the same offense. (See Pardon Record)

Wednesday May 17 1837.

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to Nelson Carter, on account of a Felony, of which he was convicted in Washington County Court, at March Term 1837, and for which he had been sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years, and also a Pardon

To John C. Bartley, on account of stealing Cows, of which he had been convicted on Indictments in Anne Arundel County in three several cases, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years, in each case. (See Pardon Record)

Saturday May 20th 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Joseph Townsend Treasurer of the Baltimore Equitable Society or to his order forty eight dollars sixty two cents on account of Insurance of Tobacco Warehouses, for contribution to make good Sunday losses, pursuant allowed.

Tuesday May 23rd 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John N. P. William Murphy or order one thousand dollars, on account of building the new Tobacco Warehouse - to be accounted for.

Wednesday May 24 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John Donnell Jones or order four thousand three hundred and seven dollars twenty three cents, on account and for balance in full of the purchase money for a Lot of Ground adjoining State Tobacco Warehouse No 3 as provided for by Law

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay David Ridgely or order nineteen dollars seventy five cents for Books from Mr Richardson How for the State Library, by Authority of the Joint Committee under Resolution of the General Assembly, & Certificate of the Librarian.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Stockell & Wilson or to their order fifty dollars for publishing in the Marlborough Gazette Sunday Laws of the last General Assembly by direction of
