states that he has a family, is living on rented land, and is obliged to
pay the said fines and costs, without doing injury to himself and family
He therefore prays for a remission of the said fines. And
the Judges of the said County and several members of the Bar
having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petition
we do hereby remit the said fines.
