Ordered that the Clerk of the Council draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore in favour of the parties entitled, for such sums of money as Richard W. Gill and Washington G. Tuck shall certify to be due and payable upon contracts made under the Resolution of the 21st of March 1837 for public Work, in relation to which we have appointed the said Gill & Tuck Super-intendants, and that the said Clerk take receipts for all such payments. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Philip Clayton or order ninety two dollars twenty five cents due him for public Work as appears by the Certificate of Richard W. Gill and Washington G. Tuck, Super-intendants. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William McWeir or order fifteen hundred and sixty nine dollars, being the amount allowed him by the Executive for printing the Journal of the Senate, for making an index to the Journal and packing twenty Boxes of the Journals for the different Counties of the State. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John W. Whittington or order forty dollars for binding ~~four~~ Volumes of the Laws of Maryland in calf for the County and Orphans Courts of the State as & amount allowed. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Charles N. Hauger or order four hundred and seventeen dollars fifty cents being for services rendered by him as assistant Engineer in the survey of the Potomac and Annapolis Canal, as & amount allowed. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay J. B. Vanderford or order fifty four dollars fifty cents viz \$4.50 for publishing Proclamation and \$50 for publishing the public acts of the last Session of the Legislature in the Caroline Advocate, by authority of the Executive. ~

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Brewer or order six dollars for three days attendance at the Government House, at \$2 per diem, taking and inventory of the goods & furniture belonging thereto, as & amount allowed. ~
