Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George G. Brewer or order seventy five dollars for one quarter salary as Clerk of the House of Delegates, due the first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard J. Crabbe, order thirty five dollars ninety nine cents for one months postage, up to the first instant, viz for the Executive \$26.57, for the Treasurer \$2.66 for the Librarian \$3.23 and for the Assistant Genl \$3.53, paid & proved.

His Excellency the Governor granted the following Pardons and Volle Rosegris viz

To Joseph Jones, a Pardon, on account of Stealing 15 lbs of Bacon, for which he was convicted in Somerset County Court, at November Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

To William Low, a Pardon, on account of passing counterfeit money, for which he was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court, at October Term 1829, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for twenty five years.

To Sam Whittington (coloured man) on account of Stealing, for which he was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court, at June Term 1833, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years.

To Robert Tatham, on account of breaking the conditions of a Pardon, for which he was sentenced on the 4th of February 1833 to the Penitentiary for five years, by Baltimore City Court.

To William McBride, a Pardon, on account of Forgery, for which he was convicted in two several cases in Allegany County Court, on the 10th of October 1836, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for four years and four months.

To Charles Quinn, a Pardon, on account of Stealing, for which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court on the 24th of February 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years.

To Thomas Brady, a Pardon, on account of an assault with intent to kill, for which he was convicted in Washington County Court, on the 10th day of December 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for ten years.

To William Hanson, a Volle Rosegris, on account of a charge of Felony, pending against him in Baltimore City Court, of which he had been found guilty.

To Susan Alberts (Mullatto) a Volle Rosegris, on account of a charge of Felony, pending against her in Baltimore City Court, of which she had been found guilty.
