Returns having been received from the several Congressional Districts, of the Election held on the twenty sixth ultimo for the Election of members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States, the board proceeded to enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given in each of said Districts for each and every person voted for as member of Congress in the respective Districts when it appeared that John Dennis Esquire in the first District, James Alfred Pearce Esquire, in the second district, John T. H. Worthington Esquire, in the third district, Benjamin C. Howard and Isaac McKim Esquires, in the fourth district, William Cost Johnson Esquire, in the fifth district, Francis Thomas Esquire, in the sixth district, and Daniel Scriven Esquire, in the seventh district, were duly elected members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States. — Whereupon the following P. R. O. C. L. A. M. A. T. J. I. & N. was issued as directed by Law, Viz

Whereas, by an act of the General Assembly of this State, passed at November Session 1815, entitled "An act to remedy and the several Acts of Assembly respecting Elections and to regulate said Elections," it is directed that the Governor and Council, after having received the returns of Elections of members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States, shall enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every person voted for as member of Congress as aforesaid, respectively, and shall thereupon declare by Proclamation, signed by the Governor, the name or names of the person or persons duly elected in each respective district: And an election having been held on Wednesday, the twenty sixth ultimo, agreeably to Law, in the several Congressional districts, for members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States, as aforesaid, and the returns of said election having been received, and the number of votes given for each and every person voted for as member of Congress as aforesaid, having been enumerated and ascertained — we do, by this our P. R. O. C. L. A. M. A. T. J. I. & N., declare that, by the said returns, it appears that John Dennis Esquire
