The petitioners state that they were summoned by a deputy Constable to aid in the execution of a State or Search Warrant, issued by a Justice of the Peace, that being ignorant of the Law in such cases, and believing it to be the bounden duty of all good Citizens to obey a State summons, and attend to the service required of them by the Officer in authority, and actuated by no other motives whatever, in this instance, they did accompany said Officer to the House of Amos Pool (the place designated in said Warrant) and there, with mildness and a due respect to the feelings of the inhabitants, proceeded to make the search required by the said Warrant. They therefore pray to be released from said fines. And sundry respectable Citizens of the said County and also two of the Justices of the said Court having recommended the petitioners to Executive Clemency, we do hereby remit the said fines.
