special trust and confidence in your prudence and fidelity, Thomas W.
Neasey, Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you my agent
to receive from His Excellency William L. Murray, Governor of the State
of New York, James Burrows and James Millen alias Lebray, fugitives
from the Justice of this State; and I do hereby authorize and direct you,
upon receiving the said fugitives, to bring them into this State, and convey
and deliver them to the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore County, to answer
a charge of having entered and robbed the store of Aquila C. Hughes, in the
City of Baltimore, of a quantity of watches and jewelry, in the night of the
twenty fifth of March last.

Given under my hand and the great Seal of the
State of Maryland, this ninth day of August in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirty seven, and of the Independence of the
United States the forty second.
