

Ordered that the Adjutant General proceed forthwith to the
Washington post the purpose of conferring with the Ordnance Department
relative to the quota of arms due the State of Maryland under the
Act of Congress of 1818

Ordered that the Adjutant General take such measures as he may
deem necessary for the return of arms & accoutrements to the stock of the late Congress
General Service

Ordered that the Adjutant General give notice in the papers of
Annapolis and elsewhere of Baltimore for proposals for building a fire
proof Magazine

By the petition of William Bateman and a transcript from
the Court of Chancery in said Court, it appears that he was fined by the
said Court, at May term 1837 the sum of fifty dollars for practicing medicine
without license and receiving remuneration therefor.

The Petition and recommendation of sundry Citizens of the
said County represents that the said William Bateman is a very worthy
man, but under limited circumstances, that he is about to leave the State
of Maryland for the State of Indiana, that the offense of which he was
guilty was in the practicing and administration of Botanic medicines,
and that they believe it will not be engaged in a further violation of
the Law, and they therefore pray for a remission of said fine. And
two of the Judges of the said Court having recommended compliance
with said prayer, - we do hereby remit the said fine
