Tuesday October 10th 1837.

The following orders were issued for the arrest and surrender
of the person therein named as a fugitive from the Justice of Pennsylvania
upon the demand and information and evidence therein referred to
being received at the Executive Department. Viz

The State of Maryland, To the Sheriff of Baltimore or any other
County in this State, greeting.

Whereas, it appears from authentic documents, certified and
transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, by His Excellency
Joseph Ritner Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, that a certain Joshua
Kopp late of the County of York in the said State of Pennsylvania, stands
charged by indictment of the Grand Inquest of the said State, inquiring
for the body of the said County of York, with having, on the first day of
April last at the County aforesaid, committed fornication with a certain
Rebecca Thomas and then and there begotten a male bastard child,
upon her body, contrary to the act of the General Assembly of the said
State, in such case made and provided, &c, and that the said Joshua
Kopp has fled from the Justice of the said State and has taken refuge
within this State. And whereas, the said Joseph Ritner, Governor
as aforesaid, hath, in pursuance of the authority given in such cases by
the Constitution and Laws of the United States, demanded the said
Joshua Kopp of the Executive of this State, as a fugitive from Justice,
and appointed a certainolinefelter Esquire, Sheriff of the said County of
York, his agent to receive the said fugitive and transport him to the
said State of Pennsylvania for trial for the said offence. And
therefore, I Thomas W. Hazen, Governor of the State of Maryland,
have thought it proper, in compliance with the said demand, to order
and direct the surrender of the said fugitive, and do hereby order and
direct that you forthwith, arrest and deliver the said Joshua Kopp
if he is to be found within your bailiwick, to the said aforesaid
Esquire, agent as aforesaid; he the said agent first paying all costs of the
arrest and detention of the said fugitive - for all which this shall be
your sufficient warrant.
