The following proceedings were adopted:

To His Excellency Joseph Ritner Governor of the State of Pennsylvania,

Whereas George F. Alberty, Andrew J. Smith and John Cubber alias John
Helms stand charged by two several Indictments, with having "on the ninth
day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven,
unlawfully and designedly and by a false pretence, obtained from one Hope
H. Matter nine bank notes of the value of one hundred dollars each, two
bank notes of the value of fifty dollars each, one bank note of the value
of twenty dollars and three bank notes of the value of ten dollars each.

And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of
this State, that the said George F. Alberty, Andrew J. Smith and John Cubber alias
John Helms have fled from justice and taken residence in the State of Pennsyl-
vania: And it being important and highly necessary for the good of Society,
that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to justice: Now therefore
I, Thomas W. Veazey Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the Au-
thority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do
hereby Demand the said Alberty, Smith and Cubber alias Helms as fugitives
from the justice of this State, and make known to your Excellency that I have
appointed Jacob Cook of the City of Baltimore my agent to receive the said
fugitives and bring them into this State, having jurisdiction of the offence
charged against them as aforesaid, that they may be brought to trial there-
for. In compliance with the requisitions of the Law, I have with me
and produce to your Excellency copies of the Indictments upon which this
demand is founded, which I certify is authentic.
