By the petition of Benjamin Berry, James I. Berry and Joseph Lloyd and a transcript from the Records of Charles County Court, it appears that they entered into a Recognizance with Thomas I. Berry as his securities in the sum of thirty three dollars and one third of a dollar each, for the appearance of the said Thomas I. Berry before Charles County Court, at March Term 1837 and for his good behavior to the said Berry, which recognizance was afterwards forfeited.

The petitioners state that they entered into said Recognizance from motives of humanity, (the said Thomas I. Berry being then confined in Jail) and that shortly afterwards, the said Thomas I. Berry left the State, and has not since been heard of by them, that no presentment found against said Thomas I. Berry, nor did he commit any breach of the peace thereafter - they therefore pray for remission of said forfeiture. And the Court having recommended compliance with the prayer of the petitioners, we do hereby remit said forfeiture.
