

Friday November 3rd 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Elizabeth Simmons or order thirteen dollars fifty cents for six months pay for cleaning the public Temple, due the first instant.

Saturday November 4th 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard J. Crath or order forty eight dollars eighty eight cents for one months postage up to the first instant, viz for the Executive \$37.84, for the Treasurer \$3.98, for the Assistant General \$5.98, and for the Librarian \$1.18, & amount.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Culbreth or order two dollars forty four cents for premium paid by him for specie to pay postages.

Sunday November 6th 1837.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Watkins, Assistant General, or order nine hundred and ninety dollars for building a new Magazine, by order of the Executive under Resolution of the General Assembly, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John T. Jackson or order eighty six dollars for publications in the Cambridge Chronicle viz \$30 for publishing Sunday Laws by order of the Clerk of the Council under Resolution of the General Assembly, \$4 for publishing Proclamation of the result of the Election of Electors of President & Vice President of the United States, \$10 for publishing Proclamation calling the General Assembly, \$7 for publishing Proclamation fixing the time of Congressional Election, \$5 for publishing Proclamation of the result of Congressional Election, by order of the Executive as authorized by Law, and \$10 for publishing Resolution of the General Assembly, & amount allowed.
