

Sunday December 13th 1837

The Council met. Present the same as yesterday.

On the nominations of His Excellency the Governor and Board
with the advice and consent of the Council the following Civil and
Military appointments were made and commissions issued accordingly:

John Adams a Justice of the Supreme Court of Walter County.

Vice Joseph B. Webb resigned.

By the petition of Isaac Ball and a transcript from
the Records of Prince Georges County Court, it appears that the said
Ball was fined by the said Court, at October Term 1837 sixteen
dollars and sixty six cents and two thirds of a cent for selling
spiricious liquor without License.

The petitioner states that he opened an ordinary or small
Tavern on the seventh day of January 1837 under the impression that
he could sell spiricious liquors without License, prior to the usual
day of taking out License, when he could mention to the Clerk of the
County, the particular day on which he commenced selling and that
the Clerk could ante-date his License so as to cover the whole
time - it having been before that time the practice of the Clerk
