

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council Thomas J. Mann was appointed Surveyor of Kent County, his salary and commission assigned to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order five dollars twenty five cents for hauling wood from the Cellar and bringing up stairs, & amount allowed.

By the petition of Rebecca Sartin and the recommendation of the Court thereon, it appears that the said Rebecca Sartin was fined by Greenbush County Court the sum of ten dollars for selling liquors without License. The petitioner states that she had obtained a License to keep an Ordinary at the Beaver Dam Farm in said County, which she supposed entitled her to the privilege of selling liquors at all other places in said County, and that, under this impression she offered for sale and did sell liquors at an Election held at Dixon's Tavern in October 1836, for which the said fine was imposed. She therefore prays that in as much as she violated the Laws through ignorance and not from design, that the said fine may be remitted. And the said Court having recommended a compliance with her prayer, we do hereby remit the said fine so far as the same is payable to the State.
