November 21st 1846

The Governor this day received a communication from J. V. L. M. Mahon declining to accept the office of Chancellor

November 23rd 1846

E. P. Roberts

The Governor this day refused to pardon Edward P. Roberts pardoned convicted in Baltimore City Court of the crime of committing a rape upon Margaret E. Harwood & sentenced on the 28th of July granted 1845 to the Penitentiary. This pardon was subsequently granted - see records of pardons

Nov 23rd 1846

J. Craft

The Governor this day refused to remit a fine imposed by Walton Gray a Justice of the Peace for Balt. City upon Jacob Craft of fine for selling goods contrary to law

Nov 24th 1846

Requisition

The Governor this day issued a requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension & delivery of Andrew Haag to Gov. of Jacob Cook (Agent) since Haag being indicted in Balt. City Court Penna for receiving stolen goods

Nov 24th 1846

The Governor this day made a demand upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension & delivery of John James Thomas to Jacob Cook (Agent) since Thomas being charged in an indictment in Balt. City Court with receiving stolen goods

Nov 24th 1846

Requisition

The Governor this day issued a requisition upon Judge William Cranch, Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia for the apprehension & delivery to Leonard Coulter Agent of Allison Mc Donald Cranch who stands charged in an indictment in Montgomery County Court with the crime of Murder

Nov 28th 1846

Remission

The Governor this day remitted a fine of thirty dollars of fine imposed by the 4th Election District Court Baltimore County G. H. & upon Geo. H. Stone & C. Stone for assault & battery upon C. Stone Thomas Wooden, it being recommended by one of the Justices of said Court & sundry Citizens

Nov 28th 1846

C. H. Parmelee

The Governor this day refused to grant a pardon to Charles H. Parmelee convicted in Prince Georges County refused Court of forgery at October Term 1846 & sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary
