The Governor this day in obedience to a requisition from the Gov. of Pennsylvania issued a warrant for the apprehension and delivery to James Maginnis (Agent) of Edward Cole & John Hughes with others indicted in the Court of Oyer & Terminer & Quarter Sessions of the peace for the City & County of Philadelphia for the Crime of Larceny

Pardon
Samuel Jacobs

The Gov. this day granted a pardon (upon the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court) to Samuel Jacobs upon condition that he leave the State never to return - he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at June Term 1844 of the Crime of Burglary & sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary - see record of pardons

The Gambrell as Hay Mighler

The Gov. this day approved the official bond of The Gambrell as Hay Mighler for the Western Sales of Baltimore

Pardon of
The Cooper

The Gov. this day refused to grant a pardon to The Cooper convicted in Baltimore City Court at May Term 1846 of the Crime of obtaining rejected goods under false pretences & sentenced to the Penitentiary for one year

J. Yates & M. Yates

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court remitted the recognizance entered into by The Yates & M. Yates for the appearance of John Freeman before said Court at June Term 1844

The Governor this day approved the official bond of Charles Bunting as Notary Public for Montgomery County

May 31st

Remission
of recognizance
P. Perry

The Governor this day remitted two recognizances of fifty dollars each entered into by Philemon Perry of Calvert County for his appearance before the Court of said County at November Term 1845

Pardon
Moses Morris

The Governor this day (upon the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court & others) granted a pardon to Moses Morris who was convicted in Balt. City Court at May Term 1845 of Felony & sentenced to the Penitentiary - see record of pardons

Remission
of fine
Isaac Fowler

The Governor this day refused to remit a fine of fifteen dollars imposed by Calvert County Court at May Term 1845 upon Isaac Fowler for assault & battery

June 2nd

D. M. Perine

The Gov. this day received the official bond of David M. Perine as Register of Wills for Baltimore County
