This day the Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him, that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of Lloyd Tilghman as Captain. Frisby Tilghman as 1st Lieutenant. Pease Marrow to be 1st 2nd Lieutenant, and Arnold Tenefield as 2nd 2nd Lieutenant of the Light Artillery for service in Mexico agreeably to the nomination submitted to the Senate by Governor Pratt on the 30th day of December 1847.

The Governor in compliance with a requisition from the Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore County or City for the apprehension and delivery up of John Jones charged with the crime of Larceny and a fugitive from the said Commonwealth, to William O. Russell the agent of Massachusetts.
