

The Governor refused to remit the fine imposed on John Loftus by Allegany County Court at October Term 1847. for a violation of the license laws of the State of Maryland.

January 26th 1848.

January 28th 1848.

Whereupon commissions were issued to the said Justices of the Orphans Court of Calvert County.

January 31st 1848.

This day the Governor nominated to the Senate the List of Civil Officers for St. Marys, Prince Georges, Somerset and Frederick counties.

February 2nd 1848.

This day the Governor nominated to the Senate the List of Civil Officers for Dorchester County.

The Governor granted a Pardon to David Hargate convicted of Perjury in Frederick County Court at February Term 1845.

February 3rd 1848.

This day the Governor nominated to the Senate James C. Nide for Captain. John Marshall for 1st Lieutenant, Jesse Dashiell for 2nd Lieutenant and William Richards Jr for Ensign in the First Baltimore Light Infantry Fifth Regiment of Maryland Volunteer Infantry.
