February 11th 1848.

This day the Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the List of Civil Officers nominated by him on the 7th inst for Anne Arundel County. The same communication informed the Governor that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the List of Civil Officers nominated on the 28th of Jan not before confirmed by the Senate, excepting the nominations of Elijah T. H. Brown and John D. Joy whose nominations were held by the Senate under consideration.

The same communication informed the Governor that the Senate advised the issuing of a new commission to Lieut Washington Hopper whose case was submitted to their consideration by his message of the 7th inst.

The Governor issued commissions to the Civil Officers appointed by him for Anne Arundel County. And also to the Surveyor and coroners appointed by him for Calvert County.

The Governor remitted the amount of interest due on the account of Joseph Stone deceased late collector for Charles County.

February 14th 1848.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate the List of Civil Appointments for Kent and Queen Anne Counties.

The Governor sent the following communication to the Senate.
