

L. M. Daniel, William Deelle and Peter Wheeler as Justices of the Peace, their nominations being held under consideration. The same communications also advised and consented to the appointment of Thomas H. Neal to be surveyor and William Mooney a Justice of the Peace for Frederick County. The same communications further informed the Governor that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the list of Civil Officers for Somerset County excepting that Littleton D. Teackle, John Howard Edward Leatherbury, Francis Bullin, John Bullin, and Levin R. Leatherbury to be Justices of the Peace to whose appointment the Senate refused to advise and consent.

Commissions were issued to the Civil Officers appointed for Somerset and Charles Counties.

March 2nd 1848.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate, the Justices of the Orphans Court for Baltimore City and County, the Coroners and Notaries Public for Baltimore City.

This day the Governor at four o'clock P. M. proceeded to the Senate Chamber and there in the presence of the members of the Senate and House of Delegates, signed the Laws passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at its present session.

March 3rd 1848.

This day the Governor nominated to the Senate the Justices of the Peace for the City of Baltimore.

March 4th 1848.

This day the Governor received from the Senate a communication informing him that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the General List of Civil Officers heretofore nominated by him, excepting Samuel Sutton, John Lancaster and Sprigg Harwood. The communication also informed the Governor that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the List of Civil Officers nominated by him for Queen Anne's County excepting John B. Thomas as a Justice of the Orphans Court of said County. That the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the List of Civil Officers nominated for Harford County, excepting Robert Holland as a Justice of the Orphans Court and William A. Pierce as a Justice of the Peace and as a Justice of the District Court. That the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the List of Civil Officers nominated for Cecil County. That the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the List of Civil Officers nominated for Allegany County, excepting George H. Hickman whose nomination was held over for consideration. That the Senate also advised and consented to the appointment of the additional List of Civil Officers nominated for Washington County.

Commissions were issued for the Civil Officers appointed for Queen Anne's Harford and Allegany Counties.
