

March 6th 1848.

Commissions were issued for the general list of civil officers appointed from the State at large, and also for the civil officers appointed for Cecil County and the additional civil officers appointed for Washington County.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate a Justice of the Orphans Court for Harford County, a Justice of the Magistrates Court for District No. 1. and a Justice of the Peace for the same county, vice those rejected by the Senate.

The Governor nominated to the Senate a Justice of the Orphans Court for Queen Anne's County vice the person rejected by the Senate.

The Governor nominated to the Senate two Directors of the Penitentiary, and also an Inspector of Ground Black Oak Bark in the City of Baltimore.

The Governor sent the following communication to the House of Delegates.

The Governor received the Official Bonds of John E. Martin appointed Notary Public at Easton, of Ambrose Fugman appointed Notary Public at Hagerstown, and also of James G. Allmatt appointed Inspector of Tobacco in the City of Baltimore, which said Bonds were severally approved.

The Governor this day nominated to the Senate an additional list of civil officers for Washington, Talbot, Montgomery, Calvert, Anne Arundel and Baltimore Counties and Howard District.

The Governor nominated to the Senate Eliphalet L. Merrill as Auctioneer in the City of Baltimore.

The Governor nominated to the Senate the Insolvent Commissioners for Baltimore City and County.

The Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him, that the Senate advised and consented to his nominations for Montgomery, Anne Arundel, Harford, Calvert, Talbot, Baltimore and Washington Counties and for Howard District, that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the Justice of the District Court of Frederick County excepting Joshua Adlesperger, Solomon Day, John Bender and Charles Worthington to whose appointments they refused to advise or consent. That the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of the civil list of officers nominated for Carroll County excepting Daniel Stull and Thomas Smith as Justices of the Orphans Court, Jacob Holmes
