

On application of Robert Fowler Esq of Washington County the Governor remitted the amount of interest due by Michael L Rofs collector of State Tax in Washington County for the year 1844.

The Governor received the Official Bonds of Francis Baldemar Tobacco Inspector in Baltimore City, of Joseph D. Williams Notary Public in Baltimore City, and of John W. Davis State Wharfinger in Baltimore City and approved the same.

The Governor nominated to the Senate William D. Bowie to be Colonel of the 2nd Cavalry Regiment of Maryland Militia vice Thomas G. Pratt who had moved out of the Regimental District.

The Governor under a Resolution of the General Assembly allowed to George R. Richardson Esq Attorney General and to Everett Steele Deputy Attorney General, each the sum of one thousand dollars, for trial of case of the State against the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company in the Baltimore County Court and in the Court of Appeals.

Under another Resolution of the General Assembly the Governor allowed to George R. Richardson the sum of five hundred dollars for the trial of a case for the State on an arbitration with Dapmore McCallough.

The Governor received the Official Bond of John Wolf appointed Notary Public at Williamsport in Washington County and approved the same.

The Senate and House of Delegates having this day by the constitution of the State closed their Legislative business, by their joint Committee invited the Governor to sign the Laws passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at its present session. Whereupon the Governor repaired to the Senate Chamber and did there sign the several Laws passed by the General Assembly and having finished the signing of the Laws returned to the Executive Chamber. The two branches of the Legislature were then adjourned sine die.

The Governor this day received from the Chief Clerk of the Senate a communication informing that the Senate had before their final adjournment advised and consented to all his Civil and Military nominations not previously acted on, except the appointment of George H. Hickman as Justice of the Peace for Allegany County, to whose appointment the Senate refused to advise and consent.

Commissions were issued to the Civil Officer heretofore appointed by the Governor, who remained uncommissioned.

The Governor received the Official Bond of Jos Reilly appointed Quaser and Inspector of Liquors in Baltimore City and approved the same.
