

March 13th 1844.

The Governor this day received the Official Bond of William Hoblitzell appointed Notary Public at Cumberland and approved the same. The Official Bond of Thomas J. Tylehart appointed Tobacco Inspector in Baltimore City, which was approved. The Official Bond of Samuel Dickinson appointed Lottery Commissioner which was also approved.

The Governor remitted the fine and costs of prosecutions against William Shorter free negro imprisoned in St. Marys County jail under the sentence of the Court at their August Term 1847.

The Governor issued his requisition to the Governor of Virginia for the arrest and delivery up of William J. W. Davis a fugitive from justice of this State and appointed John Zell the agent to receive the said fugitive from justice and to bring him into this State.

March 15th 1848.

The Governor this day received the Official Bond of John Debow appointed Assistant Flour Inspector in Baltimore City and approved the same.

The Governor commissioned sundry Military Officers of the 1st Regiment of Maryland Militia and of Volunteer Mounted Riflemen attached to the same Regiment.

The Governor appointed and commissioned certain Civil Officers in Talbot Montgomery, Washington, Frederick, Carroll, Allegany and Baltimore Counties.

March 17th 1848.

The Governor this day received the Official Bonds of Jas Patrick appointed Notary Public in Baltimore City, of Jesse Jarrett appointed weigher of Hay and Straw at the Western Scales in Baltimore City, of George W. Morgan appointed Inspector of Tobacco at warehouse No 2 in Baltimore City, and of Christian Shepherd appointed Notary Public at Hagerstown and severally approved the same.

March 18th 1848

The Governor this day received the Official Bonds of Thomas L. Howard and John Malone appointed Quagers in Baltimore City, of John S. Gittings appointed Commissioner of Stamps and approved the same.

The Governor rejected the application for the remission of a fine imposed by Charles County Court on Walter W. Revere of said County, as also the application for the remission of a fine imposed by Montgomery County Court on W. W. Anderson of said County. The Governor refused an application for Pardon of William Harrison alias Lee convicted of Felony in Baltimore City Court at September term 1847.

The Governor also refused to remit the amount of interest due by Samuel Watkins Collector of State Taxes in the 11th District of Baltimore County.
