

March 25th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John Donahoo a Justice of the Peace for Cecil County vice Pearson resigned.

The Governor rejected the application of Jacob Eakle of Washington County for a Nolle Prosequi.

March 27th 1848.

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Charles Nickerson charged with manslaughter in killing one Peace Keller at Laurel Factory in Prince George's County.

The Governor refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi to John Brown Schleigh of Washington County charged with keeping a Billiard Table without license.

March 28th 1848.

The Governor this day received the Official Bond of Isaac M. Demers Warden of the Penitentiary and approved the same.

The Governor appointed and commissioned D. C. Mulligan vice D. D. Mulligan a Justice of the Peace in Allegany County. Henry S. Maddux vice Charles Fountaine resigned and Geo A. Scarborough vice Geo A. Scarborough Justice of the Peace in Somerset County. Alvin Lenter vice Alvin H. Lenter, Reuben T. Mannaker vice Reuben M. Mannaker, Isaac Burton sen. vice Isaac Burton Jr and George C. Patterson vice Thomas W. Hyde resigned Justices of the Peace in Montgomery County.

March 30th 1848.

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to the named persons, John Baker, William S. Jackson and George W. Lockerman, presented by the Grand Jury of Dorchester County and charged with bribing and paying one Thomas Langfit a voter sixteen dollars for voting on the 6th day of October 1847. He also granted a Nolle Prosequi to Isaac W. Lowe of said county who stands charged with bribing and paying to William Thomas a voter four dollars. And he also granted a Nolle Prosequi to Benjamin D. Jackson of the said county who stands charged with offering to bribe one Levin Maynard a voter by offering him twenty five dollars in gold on the 6th of October 1847.

March 31st 1848.

The Governor this day gave a draft to James Iglehart for Five hundred dollars in part and on account of an order drawn by William McKeir in favour of said Iglehart for the payment to him of the proceeds of the contract of said McKeir for printing the Laws &c of the last session of the Legislature. This payment being in advance on said contract for printing.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Joshua F. Cockey, a Justice of the Magistrates Court of District No 8 in Baltimore County vice Joshua F. C. Talbot resigned. He also appointed and commissioned James Tucker a Justice of the
