

The Governor issued a requisition to the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania for the apprehension and delivery up of Edward Hamer alias Britton who stands charged on the oath of Capt John H. Conly with stealing a sum of money from him.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Fisher as Associate Justice of the Orphans Court of Carroll County vice George Crabbs resigned.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Joseph Breager as District Justice of the first district Court in Carroll County vice John Jones resigned.

The Governor received the certificate of the qualification of W. F. Dome John H. Frick and Daniel Smith as Commissioners to take the acknowledgment of deeds in the State of Pennsylvania. The certificate of the qualification of T. Barry Callicott as Commissioner to take the acknowledgment deeds in the State of New York. And also the certificate of the qualification of James D. Thornton as Commissioner to take the acknowledgment of deeds in the State of Tennessee.

The Governor transmitted to the President the Resolutions of the General Assembly of Maryland tendering to Lieut Raphael Semmes of the Navy, the thanks and congratulations of his native State for his gallantry at the siege and capture of Vera Cruz, and for his services and good conduct as Aid to Gen Worth at the battles of Contreras Churubusco Molino del Rey, Chapultepec and at the City of Mexico, and recommending him to the President for promotion. These resolutions were accompanied with a letter from the Governor highly commendatory of the conduct of Lieut Semmes, and expressive of the wish for his promotion as a merited reward for his gallant services in the war with Mexico.

The Governor on the 4th inst appointed and commissioned Henry E. Beatty as captain of the 4th company of the 1st Battalion of the 54th Regiment of Maryland Militia.

The Governor commissioned Lyde Godwin M^r Blair as Notary Public to reside in Baltimore City to which office he had been previously appointed.
