

April 7th 1848.

The Governor this day received and filed the Official Bonds of the following named persons appointed officers of the Maryland Penitentiary by the Directors for the year 1848. to wit: Peace by Roberts Assistant Warden, Edward P. Roberts Secretary and Clerk to the Board of Directors, Frederick Schetter Bookkeeper, Wesley W. Wiggins Messenger, Samuel Mules Night Watchman, Peter Ham and Francis W. England Police Officers, Benjamin Shipley Frederick Baker, Elisha T. Wins, Solomon S. Saunders, William Hatchelton, Nicholas Boone, James Armors Wallguards and Deputy-keepers, John Peck Hospital Guard, William Croshaw Dormitory Guard, Elizabeth Shipley Matron, Joseph W. Kline Superintendent of Carding and Spinning, Joshua C. Davis Superintendent of Cord-twining, James Michael Superintendent of the Dyeing, Aaron Cain Superintendent of Nail making and Gavin McBrat Superintendent of Weaving.

The Governor transmitted to Lieut Elzey of the Army the Resolutions of General Assembly of his conduct in the war with Mexico. These resolutions were accompanied with a letter from his Excellency.

April 8th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George H. Cole as Captain, Gist F. Cokey 1st Lieut and Garrett Stitt as 3rd Lieut of the Warren Guards 1st Independent Volunteer Regiment of Baltimore County.

April 10th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Richard W. Hook as Justice of the District Court of the third district in Baltimore County vice Richard Hook erroneously commissioned heretofore.

The Governor this day remitted two fines of fifty dollars each imposed on Peter Liffy by Carroll County Court at April Term 1848 for selling liquor without license; these fines were remitted on the recommendation of a number of respectable citizens of said county stating that Liffy was in jail that he was without means and his family distressed and needy.

The Governor received and approved the Official Bond of Richard Aringdale appointed Quasar of Barks in Baltimore City.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Francis J. Brunnett Justice of the District Court for the First district of Charles County vice Joseph H. Cooksey resigned. He also appointed and commissioned Thomas J. Warrington Justice of the Peace for Baltimore City and County to reside at Canton vice Peter Mowl resigned.

April 11th 1848.

The Governor this day received and approved the Official Bond of Thomas Watson Assistant Flour Inspector in Baltimore City.
