

April 18th 1848.

The Governor this day issued a requisition to the Governor of the State of Virginia for the apprehension and delivery up of Frederick Weigold a fugitive from justice charged with robbing Jacob C Rumpf of about two hundred and fifteen dollars in gold in the following words to wit:

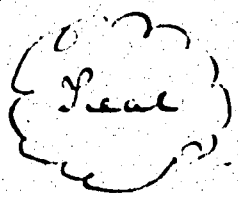
State of Maryland, to wit:

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland

To his Excellency, the Governor of Virginia.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that Frederick Weigold stands charged upon the oath of one Jacob C Rumpf with robbing him the said Jacob C Rumpf on the night of the first inst of a leather purse containing about two hundred and fifteen dollars in gold; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Virginia.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Frederick Weigold be apprehended and delivered to John Zell who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.



In witness whereof, I have hereto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State, this eighteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Frost an Associate Justice of the Orphans Court of Howard District vice James Beakle resigned.

April 22nd 1848.

The Governor this day Pardoned and remitted the fines imposed on George James, Robert Perry and George W. Campbell convicted in Baltimore City Court of conspiracy and heretofore sentenced to confinement in the Baltimore County Jail. The Governor also pardoned Pherry Wilson a free negro heretofore convicted in Queen Anne County Court and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary.

The Governor remitted the fine imposed on Jacob Brown Schling by Washington County Court for keeping a Billiard table without license, the said fine having been remitted on the recommendation of numerous citizens of said County.

The Governor appointed and commissioned John D. Nichols a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County vice N. J. Worthington resigned.
