

May 8th 1848.

The Governor this day received and approved the Official Bond of James C. Hyland appointed Quaker in Balt city.

The Governor remitted the fine imposed by Washington County Court on Benjamin Lancaster for selling spirituous liquor without license. The fine imposed by Calvert County Court on Henry Tanner for assault and battery and that imposed on Henry Matthews by Carroll County Court for assault and battery.

The Governor rejected the applications severally of Philip A. Ware of Charles County, of David Andrews of Baltimore City and George Bray of Baltimore City for pardon each of whom are confined in the Penitentiary. And also the application of William Hubbard of Baltimore City for pardon, who is confined in the Baltimore jail.

May 9th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George W. Herring Captain, Edward Diffenderfer 1st Lieut and George W. Stevenson 2nd Lieut of the Maryland Artillery attached to the 1st Regiment of Volunteer Artillery 1st Brigade and 3rd Division Maryland Militia.

May 10th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned James Williard 1st Lieut. and Francis A. Hoffman 2nd Lieut of the Cavalry 1st Regiment of the 1st Regimental Cavalry District Maryland Militia.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Thomas Dewley Justice of the Peace in Queen Anne's County vice Frank Pascault resigned. He also appointed and commissioned George W. Ritter a Justice of the District Court of the 9th District of Baltimore County vice Michael Alder resigned.

The Governor granted a pardon to Charles Graham convicted of an Assault and Battery in Calvert County Court and sentenced to confinement in the County jail for fifty days.

May 11th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Joseph P. Picher Justice of the Peace in Cecil County vice George Davidson resigned.

The Governor rejected the application for a Nolle Prosequi to John H. Urquhart who stands indicted in Anne Arundel County Court for Forgery.

May 12th 1848.

The Governor this day pardoned Abraham Matthews who had been convicted of Felony in Baltimore County Court, the pardon having been granted on the recommendation of the Judge, the Jury, the Sheriff and numerous other citizens of said County.
