

The Governor granted a pardon to Peter Miller convicted in Baltimore City Court of stealing carpenters tools the property of Henry Forrest, he having been recommended to Executive clemency by the Judges of the Court and by the said Forrest.

The Governor appointed and commissioned John H. Hoppe Chief Justice of the District Court of the 7th District in Carroll County vice Isaac Shriver declined; and Jesse Manning Associate Justice in same District Court vice Hoppe appointed chief.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Andrew D. Lindsay Chief Justice of the District Court of the 5th District in Harford County vice Ignatius Rutledge declined; and George Hays Associate Justice in the same District Court vice M. Fadden declined.

The Governor appointed and commissioned James Morgan Justice of the Peace for Washington County vice James Morgan erroneously commissioned.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Thomas Metcalf Associate Justice of the District Court in the 4th District in Frederick County vice Ephraim Carmack declined; and John Storkman of no Associate Justice of the District Court in the 14th District in said County vice Jacob Leacter declined.

The Governor remitted the forfeited recognizance of William A. Gregory for his appearance before Talbot County Court to the extent of the interest of the State therein.

The Governor granted a pardon to Henry Myers who was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court at April Term 1841 of stealing sundry articles of merchandise and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the term of ten years.

June 1st 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William Fizzel of Carroll County Inspector of Leather in Baltimore City vice Peter Hull deceased.

The Governor refused to remit the amount of interest due by Josias Clements, Collector of State Taxes for Charles County, application having been made by Samuel Sheriff one of the sureties on the collector's bond, suit having been brought on the collector's bond and judgment obtained for the arrears due the State by said collector.

June 2nd 1848.

The Governor this day received from the Commissioners, appointed by him on the 18th of May last to view and report on the condition of the completed portion of the Frederick and Emmittsburg Turnpike, their return; whereupon in conformity with the Act of Assembly he issued his commission to the President of the Company for the erection of toll gates and his license for the collection of tolls on the said Turnpike Road which was reported as completed.
