

June 5th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William Goldsborough Justice of the Peace for Queen Anne's County vice Samuel Carter resigned.

The Governor appointed and commissioned R. C. Bell 1st Lieut of Company 6. of the Maryland and District of Columbia Regiment in Mexico vice J. D. Jones resigned. William Doushears 1st Lieut in the "North Infantry" 10th Regiment M. M. vice Sumner resigned. Martin Lyon Captain and Peyton Skinner 1st Lieut in Company No 6. of 10th Regiment M. M. And William J. Gittings Quarter Master in the 5th Cavalry Regiment 3rd Brigade M. M. vice Griffith promoted.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Hanna Associate Justice of the District Court of 9th District in Frederick County vice Stephens resigned.

June 7th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Joshua Jos. Turner Lt Col. Walton Gray Major and John C. Nunda Captain in 27th Regiment M. M.

June 10th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Heronemus Brunneison Justice of the Peace in Frederick County vice W. Druseen erroneously commissioned.

June 13th 1848.

The Governor this day on the recommendation of the Judge of Baltimore City Court pardoned Francis Winter and remitted the fine imposed on him by the said Court on his conviction for assaulting and beating his wife.

June 14th 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William D. Morgan Notary Public at Havre de Grace his official bond having been received and approved.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Asa Hyatt Justice of the Peace in Montgomery County vice R. Selman resigned; and Daniel Lamborn Justice of the Peace in Howard District vice T. G. Harmon declined.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Owen C. Jones as Captain, James C. Usher as 1st Lieut and Edward Tilden as 2nd Lieut in Company No 7. 19th Regiment. M. M. He also appointed and commissioned James Gooding as Captain, Isaac A. Ireland 1st Lieut and George W. Vincent 2nd Lieut in Company No 8. 19th Regiment Maryland Militia.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Jacob Stottlmyer, John Hurley and Franklin G. H. Hays Justices of the District Court of the 6th District in Frederick County, the said District being a new District laid off by the law of last session Chapter 52.
