

The Governor appointed and commissioned Matthias Hammond 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut George Howard 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut. Robert Piper 3<sup>rd</sup> Lieut and John R. Brown Ensign of the Howard Light Horse attached to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regimental Cavalry District M. M.

November 24<sup>th</sup> 1848.

The Governor this day on the recommendation of Judge Crain remitted the forfeited recognizance of H. D. Hutton, James G. Cadde and George T. Edelin of Prince Georges County.

November 27<sup>th</sup> 1848.

The Governor this day pardoned Robert W. Willett and remitted the fine of fifty dollars imposed on him by Montgomery County Court at November 1848.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Merrill Hearn Notary Public to reside at Salisbury in Somerset County. Andrew D. Lindsay Chief Justice of District Court No 5 in Harford County, having failed to qualify under former commission. John Alexander of Jacob and Ruben G. Rice justices of the Peace in Frederick County vice James M. Rice and Joseph Pows declined to serve Ephraim Jackson Triplett justice of the peace in Baltimore County vice Jesse M. Lowe resigned.

The Governor remitted the fine of five dollars imposed on William A. Stabb by Talbot County Court at May Term 1844; he also remitted the forfeited recognizance of the said Stabb on the recommendation of the Judges of Talbot County Court.

The Governor granted a pardon to Charles E. Goodwin, therein remitting the sentence of banishment imposed on him, by the pardon granted to the said Goodwin on the 8<sup>th</sup> of October 1847.

November 29<sup>th</sup> 1848.

The Governor this day on the recommendation of numerous highly respectable citizens of Frederick County, granted a pardon to Jacob Bucher convicted of Felony in Frederick County Court.

December 2<sup>nd</sup> 1848.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William A. Browner Chief and John D. Lawson Associate Justice of District Court No 1. in Charles County vice Brimmeth removed from County and Browner made Chief Justice in said Court. He also appointed and commissioned Joseph Stretch Justice of the Peace in Frederick County vice W. G. Howard removed from County.
